

What to Expect

Here is a list of things to walk you thru the roof process!

Before Construction Day

- The perfect roofing job starts with the homeowner. Communicate all concerns/troubles you have with your roof to your Roofing Advisor. Have you converted to a high efficiency furnace and no longer need the flue pipe? Does the ice buildup on your roof, then fall off in large chunks? Do you want to add gutters or any additional construction to improve the value of your home? Now is the time to fix these problems!
- Even though your repair will be completed in a day, roofing is major construction. Walk around your house the day before the job and move anything that you would not want in a construction zone.
Common items are:
Patio Furniture Solar Lights
Statues Potted Plants
Garden Gnomes Grills
- Please mow your lawn the day before we come. This will help during clean up time after your repair is completed.
- There will be a lot of shaking. Make sure to take down any pictures or move items that you want to be extra careful with to a safer location during construction.

On Construction Day

- Your responsibility as part of our crew is minimal. First, make sure your car is out of your garage and try to keep the driveway open. What if I don't have a driveway? Live in the country? Talk to your roofing advisor about where you want the trucks and trailers parked.
- Do you have a pet/animal that could be out during construction? All we ask is that you please secure them to protect and ensure safety for both our crews and your animal.
- Inform your neighbors that you will be having construction so they can take precautions for safety to their property as well.
- As with any construction sight, access will be limited for the safety of everyone involved. We will be putting up caution tape around the site to limit access. If you need to be home for the day, please communicate with the team so they know when you are coming and going.

After Construction

- Do you have a Satellite on the roof? We will do our very best to get it back in the same position that it was when we removed it, however in some cases the signal will not reestablish and the satellite company will have to come out and align it. Your insurance company usually includes this in your roofing settlement.
- If there is one thing Justin instills into his team members, it's the importance of perfect cleanup. He is known for saying "Leave the property better than how we found it". However, keep your eyes open in case there are any stray nails that evade our magnets.
- Our policy is to have the magnet ran over the yard three times after each job.
- You might notice some left over shingles, felt paper, or other supplies. We have learned that it's much more efficient to order a little extra than to run short and have to wait days or even weeks to get the missing material in. You are not charged for this excess, and we will be picking up any material left over. If you want a few shingles left on the site for any reason, please let your roofing advisor know.
